Ash Wednesday Service March 6 7:00 pm (details on Page 8) **Shrove Sunday Pancakes!!!** No, you're reading that right - Shrove **Sunday**, not Tuesday! On Sunday, **March 3**, we will celebrate Shrove Sunday with a pancake lunch/brunch in the Fellowship Room. We need volunteers to bring in griddles, pancake mix, syrup, etc., so please indicate what you'll bring on the sign-up sheet downstairs.

Did You Know:

Quinquasegima is the 50-day period before Easter, which begins on Shrove Sunday - the Sunday before Ash Wednesday.

To shrive: to confess, ask for forgiveness, receive absolution; **shrove** is the past tense of shrive. **Historical note:** The Shrove period originated in the Middle Ages and started on the Sunday before Ash Wednesday. It was a three-day celebration that culminated in a feast on Tuesday evening. During Lent, consumption of foods such as milk, eggs, meat, and fats was restricted. In order to use up those foods, the English began the tradition of making pancakes in order to use up as much milk, eggs, and fat as possible so they wouldn't spoil. In France, consuming primarily fats and fatty foods on this day is what led it to be known as "Fat Tuesday" or *Mardi Gras*.

Grace and Peace to you, in the name of our Lord, Jesus Christ!

For three consecutive Sundays this month, I will be running an 'Inquirer's Class.' While I have highlighted the class here briefly, I would like to share with you more about what each class entails.

For our first session, we are going to get to the very meat and bones of what it means to be a Christian. Consider it – Christianity 101: a rough sketch of Christianity across the theological board. We will talk about the Trinity, Scripture – some of the very essential passages – and what life and death and resurrection in Jesus Christ means. All classes will be one hour, so again, it is a very brief overview, but a place to start to learn and ask questions.

Our second session focuses in on the Presbyterian Church (U.S.A.) and what we called the Reformed Tradition. We will talk about where the PC(USA) came from, its essential beliefs, and the governance that rules the church. We will also highlight some of the ways in which the PC(USA) works nationally and internationally.

Our third session is about Springfield. We will talk about Springfield's deep and rich history, where it has been and where we are seeking to go. We will talk about the gifts that are present and the ways in which this specific church is organized.

At the close of these sessions, there is an invitation to join the Springfield Family in a formal way through membership. The benefits of membership are the opportunities to serve on committees and Session, as well as having both a voice and vote in congregational meetings. Whether or not you are a member in the books, you are family, but this opportunity to make it official does open doors of service.

Join Us For a Crafting Afternoon - Ukrainian Eggs

What is Pysanky? Ancient Ukrainian folk art of writing on eggs using a wax-resist method.

What will we do? We will learn how to decorate Easter Eggs using the traditional Ukrainian technique, Pysanky. You will be using a wax writing tool (Kistka), candle flame, batik dyes and beeswax. It is a slow and methodical process but anyone can do it We will learn about the artform, talk about the Christian symbolism of the Easter egg, and spend time working individually and in fellowship with others.

Our annual Ash Wednesday service is always a meaningful time of prayer and reflection. This year we will include a guest cellist from Liberty High School, Lily Riesett with the Adult Choir's anthem *Mercy Still*. If you don't usually attend this service, consider coming this year. You may find that this is one of the most moving services of the church year.

"Ash Wednesday begins the season of Lent with a public act of confession and contrition. Acknowledging that all have sinned and fallen short of the glory of God, we stand in solidarity as fellow creatures before our Creator, acutely aware of our mortality. In the face of our transience, we pledge ourselves anew to live unto God's Word in Jesus Christ, the eternal Word that remains forever. Ashes on the forehead is a sign of our humanity and a reminder of our mortality. Lent is not a matter of being good, and wearing ashes is not to show off one's faith. The ashes are a reminder to us and our communities of our finite creatureliness. The ashes we wear on our Lenten journey symbolize the dust and broken debris of our lives as well as the reality that eventually each of us will die."
